

RECIPE OF THE MONTH



Carrot Cake Bars

INGREDIENTS

CARROT CAKE BARS INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 cup avocado oil (or vegetable oil, or any mild-flavored oil)
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 12/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 11/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon fine sea salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- Pinch of ground cloves

INSTRUCTIONS

- 8 ounces finely-grated* fresh carrots
- Optional: 1/2 cup chopped nuts or 1/4 cup raisins

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (8-ounce) package low-fat cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 cups sifted powdered sugar (use more/less to achieve your desired consistency)

1. Prep oven and baking dish. Heat oven to 350°F. Mist a 9×9-inch baking dish with cooking spray, and set it aside for later.

- 2. Mix the wet ingredients. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together oil, granulated sugar, and brown sugar until combined and smooth. Add in the eggs and vanilla and whisk until smooth.
- 3. Mix the dry ingredients. In a separate bowl, whisk together the remaining dry ingredients (flour, cinnamon, baking soda, salt, baking powder, nutmeg and cloves) until combined.
- 4. Combine. Gradually add the dry ingredient mixture into the egg mixture, and stir until smooth. Fold in the grated carrots and stir until combined. If you would like to add nuts and/or raisins, stir them in at this time as well. Pour the batter into the baking dish, and spread it out evenly.
- 5. **Bake**. Bake for 35-40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the middle of the cake comes out clean. Transfer the baking dish to a wire cooling rack and let it cool until the cake reaches room temperature.
- 6. Make the frosting. Meanwhile, in a separate mixing bowl, combine the cream cheese, butter and vanilla until evenly combined. Gradually add in the powdered sugar and stir until smooth. Feel free to add more/less powdered sugar to achieve your desired frosting consistency.
- 7. Frost and serve. Once the cake has cooled, spread it evenly with the cream cheese frosting. Then slice, serve and enjoy!

SECURITY CORNER

Nexus Android Trojan

A recent report from the Italian cybersecurity firm, Cleafy, discovered a new Nexus Android banking trojan capable of targeting different banking and financial applications.

The Nexus Android Trojan is a type of malware that targets Android devices. Its primary goal is to steal sensitive information and data from the infected device such as login credentials, contact lists, and financial information.

The malware can also take control of the device and perform various malicious activities such as sending spam messages or making unauthorized phone calls as well as bypass two-factor authentication measures.

The Nexus Trojan typically infects devices through fake or malicious apps that are downloaded from third-party app stores or other untrusted sources. Once installed, the Trojan disguises itself as a legitimate app and runs in the background, making it difficult for the user to detect.

To protect yourself from the Nexus Android Trojan, it is important to only download apps from trusted sources such as the Google Play Store. Additionally, you should keep your device's operating system and security software up to date to help prevent malware infections.

Spot Crypto-Related Scams

Scammers continue to find ways to steal your money. In a recent scam tactic, these fraudsters demand payment using cryptocurrency. Scammers are often impersonating businesses, government agencies, and love interests.

Here are some common investment scams:

- An alleged "investment manager" contacts you randomly.
- A scammer pretends to be a superstar who can increase any cryptocurrency you send them.
- An online "love interest" asks that you send money or cryptocurrency to help you invest.
- Scammers guarantee that you'll make money or promise big payouts with a return.
- Scammers make claims without providing details or explanations.

To avoid business, government, and job impersonators, know that:

- First Federal/Home Building Savings Bank will never request/demand that you transfer, buy, or pay with cryptocurrency, nor will any legitimate business.
- No business or government will email, text, or message you on social media to request money.
- Do not click on a link from an unexpected text, email, or social media message, even if it appears to be sent by a company you are familiar with.
- Don't pay anyone who contacts you suddenly requiring payment with cryptocurrency.
- Never pay a fee to get a job. If someone asks you to pay upfront for a job or says to buy cryptocurrency as part of your job, it's a scam.
