Certificates of Deposit have been issued by banks since the early 1800s. CDs issued by American banks weren't immediately insured by the federal government until the creation of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) in 1933. ## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

#### **Sloppy Joes**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- ¼ cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup chopped green bell pepper
- ¾ cup ketchup, or to taste
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar, or to taste
- 1 teaspoon yellow mustard, or to taste
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- Salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 6 hamburger buns, split

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Heat a large skillet over medium heat. Cook and stir lean ground beef in the hot skillet until some of the fat starts to render, 3 to 4 minutes. Add onion and bell pepper; continue to cook until vegetables have softened and beef is cooked through, 3 to 5 more minutes.
- Stir in ketchup, brown sugar, mustard, and garlic powder; season with salt and pepper. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 20 to 30 minutes.
- Divide meat mixture evenly among hamburger buns.
